Cognitive Science is an interdisciplinary research area concerning thinking and communication of humans and machines from a technical and biological perspective as well as humanities/social science perspective. In society today, the growth and use of advanced information technology (IT) is accelerating. As a result, there is an increased need for people with technical knowledge as well as knowledge within the area of science of humanities. The boundaries between traditionally technical areas and areas traditionally regarded as the humanities and social science is slowly being erased. Moreover, lately the connection between these two areas and biology have grown. Research and teaching within cognitive science is greatly enhanced when social science and humanities aspects of IT are taken into consideration. This is very relevant for future IT development.
